Everything we do is led by inclusion, accessibility and participatory democracy. Empowering our community to participate in decision-making and reducing the impacts of modern life behaviours across energy use, travel, and waste are core elements of our organisation.

We provide a living laboratory to test and develop sustainable behaviours through our five main projects: the Swapshop, bike maintenance and cycle skills workshops at the Wee Spoke Hub, our Food Sharing Hub (Scotland's first rescued food shop), Endof-Term Collections and a programme of upcycling workshops and events online and at our central Edinburgh Zero Waste Hub.

The Wee Spoke Hub is an inclusive community bicycle hub and workshop space where we aim to help make cycling an affordable, attractive and accessible mode of sustainable transportation for everyday use. By applying to the Edinburgh Community Climate Fund, we aim to relaunch the Wee Spoke Hub and design new workshops for under-represented groups in cycling, such as women, LGBTQ+ groups, BAME communities and people experiencing homelessness.

We want to support the people of Edinburgh in their choice of sustainable solutions by providing basic cycling skills training and route planning workshops; we also want to help populations that would not traditionally turn to cycle as a mode of transport (for economic or inclusivity reasons alike) to make that change and not to turn back. The workshops will help us build engagement to continue offering tools and expertise to those experiencing barriers to cycling and sustainable travel. Through our programme of activities, we will offer access to learning opportunities and mentoring; provide and help users gain affordable travel support to access services, leisure activities and job opportunities; and increase their independence and social connection.

We will provide access to second-hand bicycles at accessible prices, which will allow them to remain in action for longer and lower the demand for new ones. We aim to sponsor at least 10 new bicycles for low-income populations and plan on fixing/refitting at least 150 more during the year. Since the average bicycle produces 265kg of greenhouse gases, we estimate the reduction in greenhouse gases to be around 42.4 tons of CO2e emissions and creating 1.5 full-time roles in the process throughout the year.

By securing the Edinburgh Community Climate Fund, we will be able to hire a Hub Coordinator and invite Sessional Mechanics to run the following workshops:

- Activity 1: Fix Your Own Bike Run 112 'Fix your own bike' workshops and reach 400-450 participants experiencing homelessness and/or financial hardship.
- Activity 2: Commuting Skills
 Run 37 confidence boosting led-rides in partnership with
 under-represented groups in cycling (LGBTQ+, women and SIMD communities)
 and reach 130-140 participants.
- Activity 3: Audience Specific Workshops
 Run 18 sessions with people who are under-represented in cycling
 (LGBTQ+, women and SIMD communities) and reach 70-80 participants.

Due to SHRUB's deep implantation in the circular economy and its strong history of activism for ecological and social justice, the Wee Spoke Hub is particularly well-placed to offer access to the benefits of cycling to under-represented groups in the cycling community and help Edinburgh Council reach our goals for change to a better future.
